PASTOR’S PAGE



The Gospel presents us with a text susceptible to different interpretations or adaptations. This may happen because we do not really understand the radicality it contains.

It seems Christ is presenting us and the disciples with a very difficult law to fulfill. For instance, the Old law affirmed: do not kill. But Christ makes it even more difficult, saying: “he who calls his brother ‘stupid’, is a murderer, too.” How can we live with this? How can we truly come to see things this way, and even more, arrive at having such a heart? What Christ tells us in this Gospel can be neither an ideal to be reached nor a duty to be fulfilled.

Let us allow ourselves to be guided by the Old Testament in understanding this text. A Wisdom text reads: “I have placed before you fire and water; to whichever you stretch out your hand, you will find either death or life.” This makes clear that Christianity is not a matter of duty, or of fulfilling a law, but is a question of life and death. Do we have an existence that has entered into Life, or are we still living under the power of death? ... Naturally, a person who lives to defend himself will necessarily defend himself from his problems. At the end of the day, our mortal condition obliges us to take care of ourselves.

However, this text within the Liturgy proclaims the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, and without this event, we cannot possibly understand this Gospel. Indeed it is only by virtue and through the power of the event of the resurrection that we can live a life that is not that given to us by our parents, which is only a mortal life, but a life that stems from the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus, victorious over death.

The mistake we often make in facing Christianity is to try to place it within the parameters of our human and mortal coordinates, transforming it into a sort of higher type of humanism, as if, at the end of the day,

we can more or less adhere to its ideal. We then compare ourselves to that ideal to measure our "goodness", much as we would do when taking our temperature with a fever. Christianity, on the contrary, is given to us from Heaven, and is a gift that is superhuman, of divine nature. The path to achieve this nature is our baptism. In this sense the sacraments make us partakers of this divine nature. Let us ask the Lord not to see this Gospel as another rule to follow, but as the way to life, a life we cannot create for ourselves, but that is given to us by our Lord Jesus Christ.

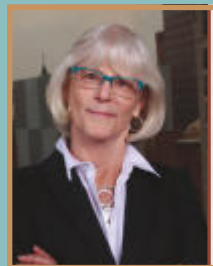
