The Gospel of today speaks to us about being ready to change our plans. Jesus having received the recent news that John the Baptist has died, desires to go to a deserted place to pray, but a large crowd follows him asking him to pay attention to their needs. The need of Christ is to be alone and pray, but the many needs of the crowd are to be healed and to eat. We immediately see the reaction of the disciples, who always look at the events without faith, that is to dismiss the crowds seeing their poor resources and thinking that it is just impossible to attend to the needs of the people. In our lives we are constantly faced with the choice of trying to either make life fit our plans (which, thanks to God, hardly works) or to answer the needs of others, our wife, husband, children, coworkers, and so forth, but even if we have the desire to do so, when we look at our poverty, we sometimes get discouraged and think like the disciples that the easiest solution is to dismiss the crowd. This is the moment to turn our poverty to Christ and to discover that we do not know what God can do with our poverty. Out of our poverty God can do miracles, if we truly entrust ourselves to him and do not hold on to what we think is good for us.

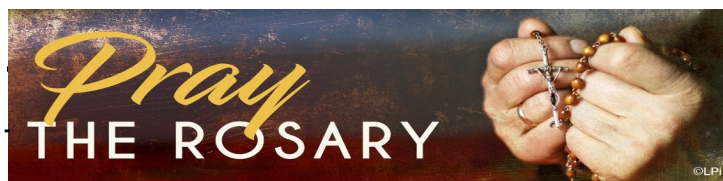
