The purpose of this is to help parishes in their promotion of different resources, to ensure the "basic" catechetical formation required by our archbishop prior to receiving each sacrament is carried out. Also, to assist families who pursue homeschooling, to make sure their catechetical formation doesn't exclude any of the following topics.

Reconciliation Sacrament Preparation Objectives

- 1. Should have a sense of prayer and a need for God.
- 2. Should desire to build a relationship with Jesus Christ.
- 3. Know about Original Sin and its effects on our relationship with God and one another.
- 4. Know what sin is and the difference between venial and mortal sin. Know how sin breaks our love for God and neighbor.
- 5. Should have a sense of sorrow for their sins. (example: Prodigal Son, woman's tears that wash Jesus's feet)
- 6. Know the 10 commandments.
- 7. Know how God offers us forgiveness in reconciliation through the role of the priest. (John 20:22-23)
- 8. Should have experience with lectio divina.

Sample questions to determine sacramental "readiness"

The following are sample questions a pastor or his delegate could use in a meeting with a child and their family to help determine if the child is disposed to receive the sacrament.

This is a resource that is meant to help you in a conversation with a child. "Perfect answers" should not be required from children.

	Objective	Potential questions	
1.	Should have a sense of prayer and a need for God.	Why is it important to pray?What does it mean to you to pray to the Father? To the Son? To the Holy Spirit?	
2.	Should desire to build a relationship with Jesus Christ.	 Why do you want to receive the sacrament of reconciliation? Tell me what you think about Jesus How would receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation help you to know and follow Jesus? 	
3.	Know about Original Sin and its effects on our relationship with God and one another.	 What is Original Sin? What happened when Adam and Eve fell? How does Adam and Eve's sin affect us today? How is life different for us now than it was for Adam and Eve? 	
4.	Know what sin is and the difference between venial and mortal sin. Know how sin breaks our love for God and neighbor.	 What is sin? Are all sins the same? What are the two main categories of sin and how are they different from each other? 	
5.	Should have a sense of sorrow for their sins.	Have you ever been sorry for doing something wrong?	
6.	Know the 10 commandments.	What are the 10 Commandments?What rules has God given us to help us live good lives?	
7.	Know how God offers us forgiveness in reconciliation through the role of the priest.	 Why do we go to a priest to have our sins forgiven? What is special about a priest compared to other people? 	
8.	Should have experience with lectio divina.	Do you pray?Do you read the Bible?What is your favorite Bible story? Why?

Sample questions to determine sacramental "readiness"

The following are sample questions a pastor or his delegate could use in a meeting with a child and their family to help determine if the child is disposed to receive the sacrament.

This is a resource that is meant to help you in a conversation with a child. "Perfect answers" should not be required from children.

	Objective	Potential questions
1.	Know the connection between Passover/Exodus and the Last Supper.	 Tell me about the story of the Passover and the Exodus from Egypt? How is that related to the Last Supper? How is that related to the Mass?
2.	Know the teaching of Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist: body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus.	 What is the Eucharist? .What are the bread and wine transformed into? Why is receiving the Eucharist important?
3.	Know the Eucharist is truly the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus.	
4.	Know that the Mass is made up of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.	What are the two main parts of the Mass?What do we do in the first part of Mass?What do we do in the second part of Mass?
5.	Should express belief in the teaching of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.	 What do you believe the Eucharist is? Do you believe Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist? What does that mean for you?
6.	Should desire to build a relationship with Jesus Christ.	How does receiving the Eucharist help you grow in your relationship with Jesus?
7.	Should have experience with Mass and desire to participate fully in it.	 Why do you want to receive Jesus in the Eucharist? What do you hope receiving the Eucharist will do for you? Tell me about an experience of prayer that you have had while preparing for this sacrament.
8.	Know how to have prayer with Jesus after receiving Holy Communion; how to have a heart to heart conversation with Jesus.	What should we do after receiving Jesus in Holy Communion?

Sample questions to determine sacramental "readiness"

This is a resource that is meant to help you in a conversation with a child. "Perfect answers" should not be required from children.

Objective		Potential questions	
1.	Know what a sacrament is.	What is a sacrament?Why do we receive sacraments?	
2.	Have an awareness of Baptism and our true identity in Jesus Christ.	What happens to a soul when a person is baptized?Whose life do we receive in baptism?	
3.	Know that we receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism and are strengthened through Confirmation.	 What does the Holy Spirit have to do with Baptism and Confirmation? When do we receive the Holy Spirit for the first time? Where do we get strengthened by the Holy Spirit? What are we strengthened for? 	
4.	Should have a sense of prayer and a need for God.	 Why is it important to pray? What does it mean to you to pray to the Father? To the Son? To the Holy Spirit? 	
5.	Should desire to build a relationship with Jesus Christ.	 Do you want Jesus to be in your life? Why? How is Jesus calling you, like the disciples, to share your faith with others (at home, school, friends, etc.)? 	
6.	Know the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit.	 What are the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit? What do the gifts help to do? Who do they help us to know? 	
7.	Know that we need to be faithful to God's commandments.	Why is it important to follow God's Commandments?	
8.	Should have experience with lectio divina.	 Tell me about an experience in prayer and/or reading of Scripture that you have had while preparing for this sacrament. How have you gotten to know God better while preparing for this sacrament?
